Important Decisions: Northwest Region's Special Assembly

**NORTHWEST DISCIPLES WILL COME TOGETHER FOR A SPECIAL ASSEMBLY
MAY 16 AT ENGLEWOOD CHRISTIAN CHURCH IN YAKIMA, WASHINGTON**

At the Living Forward special northwest regional assembly, congregational representatives will consider the RISE Ministry Plan and the recommendation of the Regional Minister Search Team.

The RISE Ministry Plan is the culmination of nearly three years of intentional work by the region to provide consensus and direction for our ministry together as northwest Disciples of Christ congregations. The Center for Parish Development has given guidance in this process, similar in focus to our own congregation's PaTH (Practicing and Teaching Hope) transformation work. The proposed ministry plan can be read at www.disciplesnw.org/rise.htm; copies are also available in the church foyer.

The assembly will also be asked to affirm a call for a new regional minister to Rev. Sandra Morgan Messick. A native of San Diego, Calif., Rev. Messick received a B.A. in Speech Communication from San Diego State University in 1985, an M.Div. from Christian Theological Seminary, and was ordained in 1989. She has served congregations in Illinois, Indiana, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Washington.

Since moving to the Northwest Region nearly 10 years ago, Sandy has served as Pastor at North Hill Christian Church in Spokane and Interim Pastor at University Christian Church in Seattle. She has actively supported the regional transformation process (RISE) by serving on the Coordinating Team, Vision Panel, Resources Design Team and Writing Team. Committed to congregational transformation, she has also participated in both the Journey of Discovery and New Beginnings programs working with several churches around the Region.

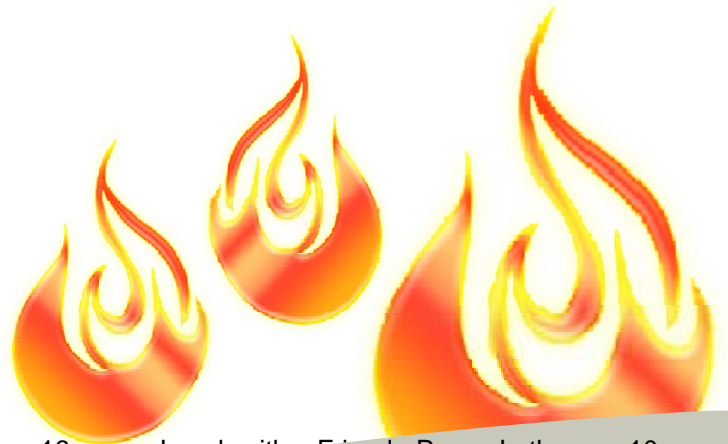
