Advent Conspiracy

CHRISTIANS RETHINKING CHRISTMAS



On the first Sunday of Advent Pastor Nancy spoke of a Christian movement called Advent Conspiracy. Several individuals asked for more information on the project and its goals.

Consider this statistic: Americans spend an average of \$450 billion a year each Christmas. That's more than \$900 per family. Is that what Christmas is all about?

In 2006 a few pastors decided to encourage their faith communities to make a change. They promoted a four-part approach to the holidays:

WORSHIP FULLY From beginning to end, enter into Advent and Christmas with the intention of celebrating Jesus.

SPEND LESS This is not a bah-humbug to Christmas, but an invitation. This year, buy one less gift. Give the gifts you want to give, but make one gift yourself. Or give the gift of your time to a friend or loved one.

GIVE MORE Not spend more, but give more. Write a letter, take the grandkids sledding, bake cookies, sing Christmas carols with friends or family. Make the love of the season visible through relational giving.

LOVE ALL Take the money you would have spent on an additional present, and give it away. Buy a goat for a family in need through Heifer International. Give money to the Puyallup Food Bank. Support disaster relief through a gift to Week of Compassion.

JIM & CASPER GO TO CHURCH: FRANK CONVERSATION ABOUT FAITH, CHURCHES, AND WELL-MEANING CHRISTIANS


The Book Club met with great enthusiasm to discuss Connie Robey's November pick *Three Cups of Tea*. In December the Book Club chose to read *Jim and Casper Go to Church: Frank Conversation about Faith, Churches, and Well-Meaning Christians* by Jim Henderson and Matt Casper.

"IS THIS WHAT JESUS TOLD YOU GUYS TO DO?"

"Light shows, fog machines, worship bands, and offering plates—is this what Jesus intended? Atheist Matt Casper wants to know.

In 2006, [Seattle resident] Jim Henderson, veteran Christian and director of Off The Map, hired Casper to join him in visiting twelve of America's best- and least-known churches, including Rick Warren's Saddleback and Joel Osteen's Lakewood. Week after week, this spiritual odd couple attended services at churches all over the country and documented their experiences at and reactions to each one. Along the way, they found the real value of their journey in the open and authentic friendship that developed as they talked, questioned, joked, and—most importantly—listened.

Follow along with Jim and Casper on their visits, and eavesdrop as they discuss what they found. Jim and Casper's articulate, sometimes humorous, and always insightful dialogue offers Christians a new view of an environment in which we've become overly comfortable: the church. And it models an important transition from "defending the faith" to "defending the space"—relational space for authentic, respectful dialogue and friendship with nonbelievers."

The great church reformer Martin Luther encouraged all Christians to remember their baptism and be thankful. He wrote,


